



Positions


- Chief
- Lane
- Chief lane
- Reserve




Preparation

- Report to the Referee 30 mins before advertised start time
- Equipment
 - pencils
 - notepad
 - clipboard
 - stopwatch
- Dress code
- No mobiles
- Avoid initiating conversation with swimmers

The Start



The Finish - protocol




Position



- At the finish end
- of the lane of the swimmer
- directly over the top
- looking down the face of the wall
- don't stand on the black strip

After each race (using stopwatches)




- Keep a personal record
- Times are *unofficial*
- Reset stopwatch on the Referee's long whistle

Open water finish



 Press "lap split"



Determining times



























Note: averaging the times is also permitted provided the Referee and Meet Director agree prior to the meet start.










AOE / SAT

- Pre-meet decision
- Average or slower



Records

- Scratch events
- AOE or 3 digital stopwatches
- 3 Timekeepers
- Reserve Timekeepers available
- Non-event winners can set records
- Sign application for record before leaving pool

Chief Timekeeper duties

Prior to meet

- Allocates duties
- Informs starting method
- Operational instructions
- Checks working
- Checks accuracy
- Informs failure procedure
- Informs check during race
- Informs reset procedure

During each race

- Inspects when necessary
- First place / possible record timing

After each race


- Signals when ready
- Informs of irregularities
- Cards to recorders
- Informs of functional irregularities

Stopwatch check procedure

- 1. All Timekeepers start on the Starter's signal
- 2. Run continuously for longest event or 400m
- 3. Stop on a pre-arranged signal
- 4. Compare times with Chief's stopwatch
- 5. Only reset to zero after Chief's check
